



## The Longcrofts 500 Years of a British Family

In *The Longcrofts: 500 Years of a British Family* James Phillips-Evans, a genealogist who is himself a descendant of the eponymous family, charts the history of the Longcroft family. It spans half a millennium and begins with a humble Wiltshire farmer, Simon Longcroft, who lived in Wilsford in the Vale of Pewsey during the reigns of the Tudor monarchs in the early-to-mid 16th century. Through 13 chapters covering almost 400 pages, including 10 detailed family trees and 109 black and white illustrations, the book traces Simons descendants into modern times, including many people alive today in the second decade of the 21st century. By about 1700 the spelling of the family name had itself evolved and settled as Longcroft, as it is borne by direct male-line members of the family today, but the name died out in the family's native county of Wiltshire, surviving only through a branch descended from an Oxford-educated clergyman who settled and flourished in the neighbouring county of Hampshire, whence the name and bloodline spread far and wide.
